**In the lead-up to COP21, the Bouygues group is recognised for its action in favour of the climate:
the Group has been added to the following SRI^a index:
the Climate Disclosure Leadership Index (CDLI) France – Benelux**

On 4 November 2015, the Bouygues group was added to the CDLI^b France – Benelux index produced by the Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP) with a score of 100 B.

- Bouygues obtained a disclosure score of **100**, the highest on a scale of 1 to 100, versus the average of 87, for the transparency of its action in favour of the climate ;
- The Group also obtained a performance score of **B^c**, the highest one being an A and the average a C.

In this COP21 year, this result is a recognition of Bouygues' commitment in favour of protecting the climate and cutting CO₂ emissions. It recognises the efforts made to save energy and improve production processes as well as internal procedures in order to achieve greater energy efficiency.

Bouygues is present in three other SRI indices: MSCI Global Sustainability, STOXX Global ESG, and Euronext Vigeo Eurozone 120, thus underlining the Group's strong commitment in the human resources, social and environmental domains.

The Carbon Disclosure Project is a non-governmental organisation that, at the request of major investors^d, carries out annual assessments of the commitment of companies to dealing with climate change. Since 2003 it has been implementing annual campaigns to collect data on the greenhouse gas emissions (GHG) of companies. The results of its survey^e determine the composition of the CDLI (Climate Disclosure Leadership Index) France – Benelux index. In 2015 it contained 19 companies that obtained the highest level of transparency with a disclosure score of 100.
